- The pruning specification must be prepared in accordance with Australian Standard AS4373-2007 by an AQF Level 3 Arborist.
- The work must be carried out by a minimum AQF Level 2 Arborist in accordance with the prepared specification.
- If the tree or shrub is (or forms part of) a Heritage Item, Aboriginal Item or place of Aboriginal Significance, you must submit your completed Tree Pruning Specification to the City of Newcastle.
- If the tree or shrub is not associated with a Heritage or Aboriginal item, you do not need to submit your completed Tree Pruning Specification to the City of Newcastle, however the property owner must retain a copy for 2 years.
