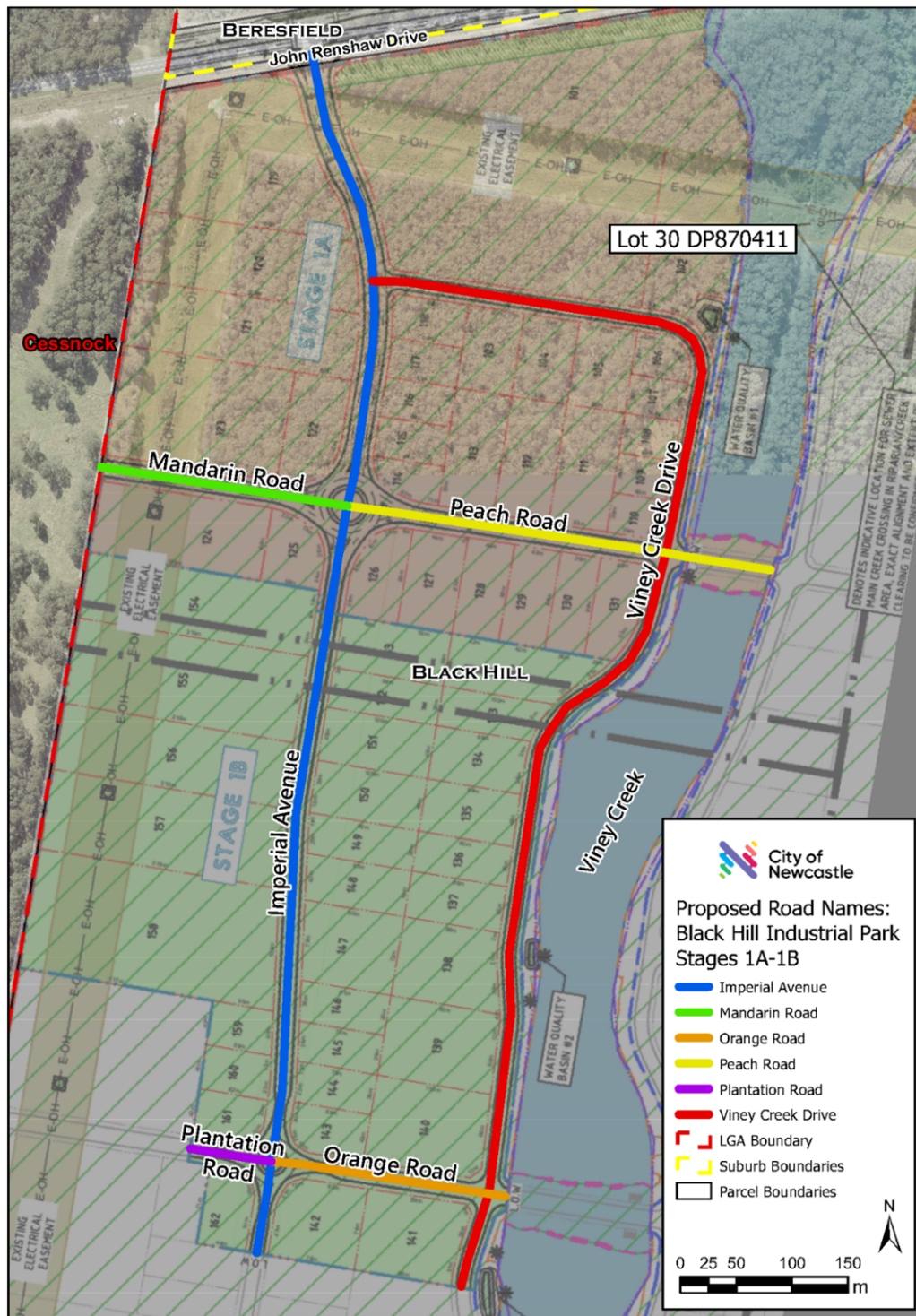
Exhibition

City of Newcastle is proposing road names for six (6) new roads in Black Hill.

This is a new greenfield development forming Stages 1A to 1B of the Black Hill Industrial Park. These roads need to be named to facilitate addressing to aid emergency service location and service delivery. Please see the below table and attached location map (Attachment 1):

	Proposed Road Name	Name Origin	Description
1.	Imperial Avenue	The road is named after the imperial variety of mandarin, an early crop in the area.	The road starts where it intersects with John Renshaw Drive and continues in a southern direction for 1092 metres before coming to an end.
2.	Viney Creek Drive	The road takes its name from Viney Creek, as it provides passage towards and alongside the creek.	The road starts where it intersects with Imperial Avenue and continues in an eastern direction for 292 metres, then in a southern direction alongside Viney Creek for 905 metres before coming to an end.
3.	Mandarin Road	The road is named after the fruit of the same name, an early crop in the area.	The road starts where it intersects with Imperial Avenue and Peach Road and continues in a western direction for 223 metres before coming to an end at the LGA boundary with Cessnock.
4.	Peach Road	The road is named after the fruit of the same name, an early crop in the area.	The road starts where it intersects with Imperial Avenue and Mandarin Road and continues in an eastern direction for 383 metres before coming to an end.
5.	Plantation Road	The name references the agricultural history of the area during early European settlement.	The road starts where it intersects with Imperial Avenue and Orange Road and continues in a western direction for 73 metres before coming to an end.
6.	Orange Road	The road is named after the fruit of the same name, an early crop in the area.	The road starts where it intersects with Imperial Avenue and Plantation Road and continues in an eastern direction for 212 metres before coming to an end at its intersection with Viney Creek Drive.

Submissions

Any person, during the specified submission period, may make submissions to the City of Newcastle concerning the proposed road names. The submissions must specify:

- the grounds of objection to the proposed names (if any).
- quote 'Black Hill Road Naming – March 2022' in the title of the submission.
- include the submitter's name, address, and daytime contact number; and
- where possible, an email address.

Please note: Submissions will only be considered that directly relate to the proposed road names. Any references to the approved development are unable to be considered as part of this road naming process.
