City of Newcastle is proposing road names for three (3) previously unnamed lanes in New Lambton, Waratah and Kotara.


These roads need to be named to facilitate addressing to aid emergency service location and service delivery. Please see the below table and attached location maps (Attachments 1, 2 and 3):


	Proposed Road Name	Suburb	Meaning	Description
1.	Arbin Lane	Kotara	Arbin is a local Awabakal Aboriginal word meaning 'beetle'.	The lane begins at its intersection with Clayton Crescent and continues in a western direction for 45 metres, then in a southern direction for another 45 metres before coming to an end at its intersection with Rodway Parade.
2.	Miri Lane	Waratah	Miri is a local Awabakal Aboriginal word for 'dingo'.	The lane begins at its intersection with High Street and continues in a northern direction for 110 metres, then in a western direction for another 60 metres before coming to an end at its intersection with Edith Street.
3.	Naruta Lane	New Lambton	Naruta is a local Awabakal Aboriginal word meaning 'lizard'.	The lane begins where it intersects with Royal Place, and runs in an eastern direction for 583 metres before coming to an end at its intersection with Bridges Road.
