Executive summary

City of Newcastle is delivering a \$1.5 million active hub in Wallsend to provide additional active recreation spaces and address the need for non-formal sporting facilities in the Western Corridor.

The active hub will be situated in a prime location, Federal Park, which is central to Wallsend town centre and nearby schools, sporting fields and Wallsend Swimming Centre. The project is supported by \$500,000 in grant funding from the NSW Government's Resources for Regions program.

To better understand community opinion on the plans for Wallsend Active Hub, CN carried out engagement between 14 February and 1 March 2021. The engagement sought to inform the community of the project, advise of the opportunity to provide feedback and to gauge overall support of the project.

Engagement activities included a door knock of Boscawen Street to inform neighbouring residents, student workshops with Stage 3 students from Plattsburg Public School, drop-in session at Wallsend Village and an online feedback form hosted on CN's Wallsend Engagement Hub Have Your Say webpage. The drop-in session and opportunity to provide feedback were promoted by media opportunity, media release, Wallsend library digital screen advertising and in-branch display, social media, onsite signage within Federal Park and DL flyers distributed to 2,100 Wallsend households and Sonia Hornery MP's Wallsend office.

Overall, community sentiment regarding the project was positive, with 94% of online feedback form respondents recording a positive response. Feedback received via the door knock, student workshops and drop-in session was also positive, however a number of recurring concerns were also raised in relation to access to public toilets, availability of parking and flooding within Federal Park. It is recommended that future project communications address these issues.

The project team for Wallsend Active Hub will now consider feedback received during the engagement period to inform the detailed design. Construction is expected to commence in mid-2021.



1. Background

City of Newcastle (CN) has committed to delivering an active hub in Wallsend to provide additional active recreation spaces to address the need for non-formal sporting facilities in the Western Corridor. The location of the active hub is situated in a prime location, Federal Park, which is central to Wallsend town centre and nearby schools, sporting fields and the Wallsend Swimming Centre.

The \$1.5 million project has received \$500,000 in grant funding from the NSW Government's Resources for Regions program.

A concept plan for Wallsend Active Hub includes the following components:

- Expanded playspace
- Bike track
- Access paths
- Multisports courts
- Rebound wall
- Climbing wall
- Fitness stations
- Seating, shelter and bike racks

2 Engagement objectives

To better understand community opinion on Wallsend Active Hub, CN carried out engagement with the community from 14 February to 1 March 2021.

More specifically, the engagement sought to:

- Inform the community of the progress of this project, and provide an opportunity to give feedback on the concept design for Wallsend Active Hub
- Gauge support for the Wallsend Active Hub

2. Communication and promotion

During the engagement period, a communications campaign was implemented to raise awareness of the plans for Wallsend Active Hub and promote the opportunity for community members to provide feedback.

Key communications activities are summarised on the following page, and key pieces of communications collateral are available in Appendix I.


3. Engagement activities and outcomes

The community were invited to provide feedback on the plans for Wallsend Active Hub from Sunday 14 February to Monday 1 March 2021. The community were able to provide comment on Wallsend Active Hub in a number of ways, with over 250 community members having their say overall.

3.1 Online feedback form

A guided submission form was available on the Have Your Say page. Respondents were asked to share what they thought of the plans for Wallsend Active Hub and invited to make further comments.

In total, 170 people provided feedback via the online feedback form and 94% responded positively with 'Looks Great!' or 'Looks OK'.



3.2 Door knock

CN conducted a door knock of 20 households located opposite Federal Park in Boscawen Street, Wallsend. Conversations took place with about half of the households, during which the overall sentiment towards the project came across as positive. General issues raised included flooding in Federal Park, access to public toilets and parking options for the site.


3.3 Drop-in session

CN held a three-hour drop-in session in Wallsend Village on Thursday 18 February 2021. 30 locals stopped to speak about the project (16 males and 14 females), with issues raised including access to public toilets, parking concerns, flooding in Federal Park, accessibility of the pathways within and leading to the proposed active hub and fencing for small children. Generally the feedback received at the drop-in session was positive.



3.4 Student workshops

CN held two 30-minute workshops with Plattsburg Primary School students on Thursday 25 and Friday 26 February 2021. The workshops were held via Zoom, with the teacher provided with a kit including all required items for engagement activities during the session.

General findings

Across the two school sessions, general discussion was undertaken with questions raised regarding specific playspace features and amenities such as parking, toilets, bubblers and shade, which would be included in the final design. Additionally, students asked about the safety of the climbing wall and whether there was opportunity for other recreational facilities in Federal Park such as rugby posts, additional fitness loops, water play and parkour facilities. This discussion was reflective of the feedback and suggestions written on post-its and placed onto the concept plan as part of the concept plan poster activity. Media & Stakeholder Relations will share this feedback with the project team.

iv. Community Strategic Plan

As the Active Hub engagement period coincided with CN's engagement on the new Community Strategic Plan, students aged between 10-11 years of age from Plattsburg Public School were



asked what would they like to have more of in Newcastle and by the year 2040 how they'd want Newcastle to be. Over 40 students participated and their valuable bright ideas will be reviewed as part of developing the new Community Strategic Plan.

4. Next steps

The project team will consider feedback received during the consultation period and develop a detailed design for Wallsend Active Hub. Construction is due to commence mid-2021.







Plan for \$1.5 million sports play hub in Wallsend now open for community feedback

Construction of a \$1.5 million active hub in Wallsend is expected to get underway mid-year, with the concept design for the project now open for community feedback.

The active hub, which draws its inspiration from a similar design in Stockton, will provide a variety of recreation facilities in Federal Park which is central to schools, sporting fields and the Wallsend Swimming Pool.

Under the plans, Federal Park will be transformed into a vibrant hub of activity with features including an expanded playspace, bike track, multi-sport courts, rebound wall, climbing wall and fitness stations.

Lord Mayor Nuatali Nelmes said that the planned active hub is expected to draw visitors from Wallsend and further afar.

"City of Newcastle identified the need to provide additional active recreation spaces in Wallsend in order to address the need for non-formal sporting facilities in the city's Western Corridor.

"Wallsend Active Hub will become an asset for Newcastle's western suburbs and is expected to attract families from outside the area who will enjoy the mix of informal recreational spaces.

"I'm pleased to invite our community to view what's planned for Wallsend Active Hub and have their say."

President of Wallsend Athletics Club Lee Grant is pleased to have the opportunity to provide input to the new facility at Federal Park where the athletics club is based.



I would suggest that the wall ball wall is in a bit of an odd space. I play at bar beach and people fit the ball over it all the time or to the sides. As it currently stands that would be hitting it into the other courts and social area. Also have a two court wall ball area like bar beach would be heaps better. I'm not sure how utilised a climbing wall will be.

Can we please have garbage bins provided and toilet and drinking water facilities. The skate park at Wallsend can look very untidy as there are no garbages there.

The new active hub looks good. It would become great with public toilets and water access. The current water access at Federal park doesn't work well at all and it isn't hygienic to get water from there. Adding toilets and water access would be beneficial to the users of this park, but also to the users of federal park in general (runners and team sports).

Looks amazing! Me and my family are soo greatful to see this concept and cannot wait for the conpletion date. We will be there daily.

surely the rest of Federal Park can do with improvements/ upgrades also. Relatively small area being catered for.

The re bound wall should be 2 sided to allow more than one game/group of people to use at a time

I'd love the adult play equipment to be adjacent to the playground, so that I can workout while I supervise my children.

There used to be a slippery dip and swing under the trees near the athletics discus area. It would be great to have play structures under the trees near the athletics area, as parents are required to stay on athletics nights, but there is nothing for their siblings to do. This equipment would help to keep the children out of the storm water and off the roads. Thank you.

No toilets

Would like to see the main Rd of Wallsend prettied up as well as better maintenance on grass cutting by Council. We are looking pretty horrible right now

Looks great, but there needs to be more car parking spaces. I live on the street and when either soccer, cricket or athletics training or game day is on you can't park anywhere on the street, so with a nice park like this going in it'll only make it even harder.

The pool car park needs upgrading and maybe another car park built down behind the canteen/ change-room of the athletics track too free up spaces on the road.

We are so excited about this project, a wonderful design for everyone in the community. Cant wait!

Just an extra comment -will the speed limit be changed along the entirety of Boscawen Street? Currently cars leave the cbd 40 zone then accelerate up Boscawen Street and then brake again at the school zone but lots of kids and families are walking along the whole street and will be hopping in and out of cars to access the active hub. It will need a full time pedestrian crossing and lower speed limits.

The concept is good.

For kids play area, a splash pool which keeps them cool in summer would be great. Kids love to get soaked during heat. This can be switched-off in winters, an option similar to seen in Oakvale wildlife park would be great.

For adults, a badminton court or a full tennis court would be great as the families can feel charged up when taking kids for play.

Good to see some activity space for 'beginners' - maybe a few more features could be added to the 'pump track'.

Two things, one is toilet facilities for the above program.

Also the park is well used and a cycle path parallel to the road would give good access to not only bicycles but also for walkers and prams.

It could be wonderful, my concerns are: parking - Boscawen street is very busy most afternoons/weekends & has very limited parks. Toilets/amenities - the pool is available to customers & the toilets at federal park are far away. Do not use wood chip, it is not accessible for all abilities and can hide dangerous materials such as needles. If this project is planned with all parties considered and accessibility a priority this park will be a great asset.

I think its a great idea

Excellent for children and there Families

It would be good if there was some BBQ put in this lovely area



The active hub will be a good addition to Federal Park and greater Wallsend community. Boscawen St would benefit from better lighting, as well as speed bumps. Drivers often speed down the street in both directions which is very dangerous-particularly on days of high activity in the park.

Bathroom (and change table) facilities are another consideration, as the closest public bathroom is quite a distance away (unless the pool will allow people to use their bathrooms).

Can not believe you want to spend money on this project but can not even fix the bridges in jesmond park or mow the grass on the Newcastle bypass

It would be beneficial to provide shade in the social area and part of the playground. Need to be sun safe and the area would be utilised more during the summer.

Please add a good friendly skate park like at Stockton

It looks fantastic but please use lessons learnt from other projects like this that have been damaged by vandalism and graffiti. Its so sad to see all that hard work and money go down the drain because vandals take pride in destroying public property.

Concrete paths and open spaces for roller sports activities

Great idea for Wallsend. Its been along time coming and after living in the suburb for 40 years, i'm looking forward to watching my children play and enjoy this space, when we visit family still in Wallsend. Thanks!

Roller skatong

A defined well lit car park is needed, particularly for parents taking small children to the play area. Current street parking is insufficient.

Flood lighting for night use and to ensure safety, along with CCTV monitoring.

I am concerned about flooding, has this been taken into account?

Not a Newcastle resident but live on the next council area and work in Wallsend. I would utilise these facilities.

Please, please don't make the fitness stations those nasty ones that council's put along walking tracks. They are pretty much useless. Instead please look into a calisthenics style park which is far more useful!

Will need toilet facilities as kids need them as do parents. I live opposite the park and constantly see men youths urinating in trees because of no toilets

More toilets & shade. Absolutely need parking!

Excellent, if the flooding problem is resolved.

- 1) I always want more seating, I'm not sure how much is included here but we need to be able to sit and supervise our kids while they play, or to simply spend some time relaxing and enjoying the space if we choose
- 2) Can/will the multipurpose courts have different coloured line markings for each sport e.g. netball (green), basketball (red), etc?



3) Perhaps add some fencing around the tennis practice court or chasing down tennis balls will take up more time than actually using the practice wall

I think it looks good but needs toilets to be practical for families to use

Looks fantastic but please make the fitness loop concrete instead of gravel as this is great for roller skating and better for running!:)

I would really love a shade cloth over the playground/playspace area. Not enough playgrounds have adequate shade over the playground itself.

Everything looks good (a pump track!!!! Yes please!!!) but it would be even better if the fitness loop was concrete instead of gravel so skate wheels can go on it too!

Please consider some trees (like Lambton park) or at least a shade cloth (like islington park) over the kids play area. The park gets SO HOT there and in summer and it's near impossible to visit until after 5pm.

Also please consider a water play station (islington park has a simple one!). Kids LOVE it and get so much out of it.

Including interpretation including heritage signals, information regarding local fauna and Flora, and a native community garden where locals could propagate local plants to plant at home to attract native birds and insects.

Could the fitness loop be smooth concrete instead of gravel or pebble Crete? Would be way more beneficial for skaters, bladers and kids on scooters:D

The area for the active hub at Federal Park is very low and prone to flooding and slow water movement through soil layers. The area will require sufficient filling and possible drainage.

Will it be fenced because people drive their motorbikes through the park. Will it be flood proof because federal park is easily flooded. Other then that it looks great, just please consider these issues.

Would love to see a second rebound wall added to the plans.

I frequently use the walls at bar beach and they are very popular, always occupied. However, I live in Lakelands and would love to not travel into town to use a court. To have more here closer to Lake Macquarie would be of great benefit to many people.

Looks great but is there going to be adequate parking as there is not enough in Wallsend now

Roller skating has made a comeback but we need super smooth flat concrete to skate. I suggest all paths are super smooth concrete or that a roller skating arena is added behind the second court.

Direct submission

There are still no public amenities included in the plan. I understand the ongoing issue with "antisocial" behaviour in the area but a playground without toilets isn't good enough. A very small number of parks in the area have access to public toilets. The closest public toilets to this park are near the Rotunda on Nelson Street (nowhere near close enough if your child needs to go).

Access to the Carpark in Winter - Due to the Pool being closed in Winter and the pool operators having the keys to open and close the carpark this area has a significant parking issue during winter months.

If you want to invest in infrastructure to make this space welcoming, useful and frequently used it needs to include consideration for reopening the carpark year round and toilet facilities.

No Shade for the playground equipment and still only 1 sheltered table/seating area - this is an issue with the current play equipment. With such a large area several more shaded seating areas where parents can supervise children and where families can sit and eat would be great. At the moment the single seating area is often occupied by adults who choose to smoke which leaves others with only 1 seat, which is in Full sun, to sit while watching kids away from the smokers. With the much larger area several more seating areas around the hub with shade would be great.

Having seen what can be done in areas like Stockton, and knowing Brickworks Park in SilverRidge Estate Wallsend has public amenities and is a "Smaller Park" I am sure you can find ways to make it work so Wallsend can get the best facility possible with this significant project.
