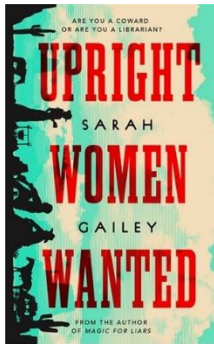


Upright women wanted by Sarah Gailey
