## **Business Pollution Prevention Fact Sheet**

Under the *Protection of the Environment Operations Act* 1997, Newcastle City Council and the New South Wales EPA have a wide range of powers to investigate and prevent pollution. In addition there are severe penalties that can be imposed for a variety of offences relating to pollution of the environment. It is your responsibility to know these offences and avoid breaking the law.



The table below shows some of the environmental offences and penalties for pollution.

## Did you know?

Management and senior staff can be held personal liable for pollution caused by their companies. That could mean up to \$1 million and/or 7 years gaol for failure to exercise "due diligence' to protect the environment.

If pollution occurs both the occupier of the land and the polluter (employer and employees) may be under a duty to notify the local Council or the EPA. If you fail to do so you could be fined up to \$2 million (corporations) and \$500,000 (Individuals).
