- Objectives in the LEP support the City Centre development and residential development
- There are some anomalies with the HCA boundary in comparison to the LEP boundaries, and CN are trying to generally marry up the LEP boundary so it is consistent with the City Centre
- Removing controls from LEP, strengthening Heritage controls
- Proposed re-zoning would also need to go through a planning proposal, public exhibition and statutory exhibition
- No boundary changes are proposed to Newcastle East, Hunter Street Mall or Civic area

- Applicants interest to get a good outcome has increased
- Currently Public Art comes is required when a development is over 45 metres, in draft DCP it will be changed to a monetary value, for development over \$5 million
- The Wallsend mural, wasn't presented to PARG. How are CN capturing these outside of the City Centre. CN are working with BIA through possible proposals and to raise Public Art profile. Local Centre upgrades currently being rolled out by the CN project team are coming to PARG to seek approval. CN also investigating a Local Approvals Policy similar to other Local Councils
- CN PARG is looking into best way to keep an audit of public art and ensure public art is maintained to a standard
- Suggestion for consideration could CN possibly have a fee included within the contribution for maintenance?
- LCAC supported and congratulated the work that the team and PARG have done with Public Art in the City.

Community Engagement Outcomes Summary:

EA	Asked if the engagement results were disaggregated against people who live there, work there and visit there to understand what the different groups of people are saying
CC	Good suggestion and we will consider how we can represent this disaggregation in the communication report as part of the Place Strategy. Action: survey results broken down into people living, working or visiting etc as part of the communication report with the Place Strategy.
MN	Noted that there is currently crime occurring in the locality, a resident completing the survey may likely sway results. Comments particularly in reference to the mixed responses received about affordable and social housing

EA	Diverse is nebulous and can mean different things - needs defining			
JM	Reword the vision to bring affordable and diverse housing to forefront			
SO	Don't need to say distinct if it already says neighbourhood			
EA	Neighbourhood in a neighbourhood is confusing, Broadmeadow is already a neighbourhood			
CC	Mentioned there are parts of multiple suburbs within precinct			
EA	Needs better clarity, adjectives up front, sport etc after			
EA	Care for Country implies passive, 'care with country' active and denotes relational connections			
MN	Ask Aboriginal people what the area means to them, maybe there is a name for it that could be used			
CC	Mentioned may only be that name for a swamp			
MN/EA	That might be fine			
SC	Need to call out the sport and entertainment element of the precinct, that's what makes it different. Current wording could be picked up and applied anywhere. Striving for regional/world class sport and entertainment			
JM	Prefers neighbourhoods over precinct or villages			
EA	Is global needed			
MB	Global is from our link to the CSP			
JM	Some of it is too generic, what's the distinctive thing about Broadmeadow, sport and housing? Supporting a growing Newcastle? Sport and entertainment should be integrated with diverse and affordable housing			
SO	Need to keep highly connected. Is representative of transport			
EA	Environmental management principle needs reframing. It's already on the backfoot making it a problem, should flip it to be more positive and working with environment. More opportunity, less constraint			
EA	Inclusive housing			
MN	Liveability needs to include accessible housing. It should be gold standard			
EA	We are visioning for Broadmeadow so we shouldn't compartmentalise			
MB	Gold standard will be referenced in our development controls/tools			
CC	Will send questions via MS Forms Survey and will consider LCAC feedback on the draft Vision, Place Pillars and Place Principles for the Place Strategy.
